

Statement from Ben Sabic, Kids Help Phone National Youth Council Chair

In the past several years, I have written nearly four dozen speeches and statements.

No amount of media training or briefings can prepare you to write a statement such as this one. After each sentence of this statement was completed, I paused for a brief few seconds – and reached for a tissue. This is without a doubt, one of the most difficult statements I have written.

As an individual who is active in the amateur sports community, I myself have travelled on a team bus on more than a few occasions. For that reason and others, the news of this accident has hit close to home.
